



Distribution of Points – 2025 Senior Series

NCGA Senior Series Player of the Year (Individual): The top 20 players on each of the Senior Series Player of the Year Lists, (Senior and Super Senior Division), as of October 16 will receive an invitation to participate in the Senior Series Championship on Monday, November 10 at Diablo CC.

The top 4 players on each points list (Senior and Super Senior) at the conclusion of the regular season will receive a PAID entry into the Senior Series Championship.

For each 2025 NCGA Senior Series event, a “point level” designation will be given based on the field size as shown in the table. Players will receive placement points for their finish in an event based on field size. A “no-show,” “no-card,” or “disqualification” will result in a player receiving no points for the event. The two-day major will be worth 2 times for the 36 holes played based on the 100+ player field even though the field might be smaller.

A player who begins their season at age 64 and turns 65 during the season will remain in the senior division for the remainder of the season.

Meaning of # of entries: The number of entries is determined by the number of registered golfers after the final closing date (generally two weeks prior to the tournament date) for each division. For example, if 50 players are registered in the Senior Series division, but four players withdraw prior to the start of the tournament and another three players withdraw or no show the day of the tournament, making the actual division size 43 players the day of the event, the field is still awarded the points based on having 50 super senior players registered at the time of the final closing date. For team events, entries still refer to individual players registered, not the number of teams registered.

NCGA Senior Series Team of the Year (Team Events): A team will receive the full value of the points awarded to the Team of the Year points list. A team comprises of two players. A player may compete with a different partner during the season but will receive separate points with the different teammate. There are no age divisions within the Team of the Year. The top-20 teams after the last Team tournament will receive an invitation to the Team Championship at Crow Canyon CC on Monday, November 3. If a player is on more than one team inside the top-20, he/she must choose which team he/she would like to compete on for the championship. The team that the player chooses not to play on will be ineligible for the championship and the next team on the list will be invited. No substitutions will be permitted for the championship. Furthermore, points are non-transferrable for players who compete on multiple teams during the season.

The top 2 teams on the Team of the Year points list at the conclusion of the regular season will receive a PAID entry into the Senior Series Championship

Ties: Players/Teams who tie for a position will split points by adding and then averaging the positions affected, **EXCEPT** 1st place, which will be tie-broken by the USGA method of scorecard playoff.

NCGA (Net) Championships: Any Senior Series player who qualifies and competes in the NCGA Senior Net Championship will receive 50 points toward the Senior Series Player of the Year list for their division whether or not they choose to participate in the championship proper. Any team who qualifies and competes in the Senior Four-Ball Net will receive 50 points toward the Senior Series Team of the Year list whether or not they choose to participate in the championship proper. To be eligible for individual points, a player must have competed in a Senior Series individual tournament prior to the Senior Net Championship. To be eligible for team points, both players on a team must have competed with one another in a Senior Series team tournament prior to the Senior Four-Ball Net Championship.

Minimum Tournament Requirements: To be eligible for the Senior Series Championship, a player must not only accumulate enough points, he/she must also have competed in at least 3 individual Senior Series tournaments. To be eligible for the Senior Series Team Championship, a team must not only accumulate enough points, they must also have competed in at least 3 regular season team tournaments that allow postable scores (e.g. four-ball net, four-ball stableford, two-person aggregate).

Points Reset: Both the Senior Series Championship and the Senior Series Team Series Championship will have the season points list reset for the championship.
